### Transformation in Christian Life





Christian life is a life that demands change. God has chosen us in Christ Jesus. The purpose of God's work in us is to restore the lost glory in humanity. The ultimate purpose of transformation in Christian life is for us to conform to the image of Christ.

The Spirit of the Lord empowers us to walk in the knowledge of the Lord. We are called to walk in obedience to the Holy Spirit (Gal. 5:16).

Let us once again commit ourselves to be transformed according to the image of Jesus Christ.
